

Non-school Materials

From Students

Students must obtain prior approval from the campus administration before selling, posting, circulating, or distributing more than 10 copies of written or printed materials, handbills, photographs, pictures, films, tapes, or other visual or auditory materials that were not developed under the oversight of the school. To be considered, any non-school material must include the name of the sponsoring person or organization. The decision regarding approval will be made within two school days.

The principal has designated the location for approved non-school materials to be placed for voluntary viewing or collection by students. [See policy FNAA.]

A student may appeal a decision in accordance with policy FNG(LOCAL). Any student who sells, posts, circulates, or distributes non-school material without prior approval will be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct. Materials displayed without approval will be removed.

From Others

Written or printed materials, handbills, photographs, pictures, films, tapes, or other visual or auditory materials not sponsored by the district or by a district-affiliated school-support organization will not be sold, circulated, distributed, or posted on any district premises by any district employee or by persons or groups not associated with the district, except as permitted by policy GKDA. To be considered for distribution, any non-school material must meet the limitations on content established in the policy, include the name of the sponsoring person or organization, and be submitted to the principal for prior review. The principal will approve or reject the materials within two school days of the time the materials are received. The requestor may appeal a rejection in accordance with the appropriate district complaint policy. [See policies at DGBA or GF.]

The principal has designated the location for approved non-school materials to be placed for voluntary viewing or collection.

Prior review will not be required for:

- Distribution of materials by an attendee to other attendees of a school-sponsored meeting intended for adults and held after school hours
- Distribution of materials by an attendee to other attendees of a community group meeting held after school hours in accordance with policy GKD (LOCAL) or a non-curriculum related student group meeting held in accordance with FNAB(LOCAL)
- Distribution for electioneering purposes during the time a school facility is being used as a polling place, in accordance with state law

All non-school materials distributed under these circumstances must be removed from district property immediately following the event at which the materials are distributed.

DRESS AND GROOMING (All Grade Levels)

The district's dress code is established to teach grooming and hygiene, prevent disruption, and minimize safety hazards. Students and parents may determine a student's personal dress and

grooming standards, provided that they comply with District guidelines. The principal or designee will be the authority in all decisions regarding the grooming and dress code. Any provision not covered in the code or any interpretation of the code will be the administrator's responsibility. If new fashions or fads arise during the school year, the school administrator will determine if they create a distraction to the learning process. Where there is a question as to the appropriateness of attire or appearance of a student, the school administrator's decision will be final.

If the principal determines that a student's grooming or clothing violates the school's dress code, the student will be given an opportunity to correct the problem at school. If not corrected, the student may be assigned to in-school suspension for the remainder of the day, until the problem is corrected, or until a parent or designee brings an acceptable change of clothing to the school or takes the child to get a haircut. Repeated offenses may result in more serious disciplinary action in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct.

JISD DISTRICT CLOTHING DRESS CODE

The clothing regulations below are expected to be followed by all JISD students:

1. Clothing should not have risqué prints, racial or vulgar/suggestive slogans (implied or stated), emblems, language or design. Print or graphics pertaining to drugs, violence, alcohol, tobacco products or any item(s) that may be disruptive or interfere with the safe operation of the campus are not permitted on any apparel, jewelry, accessories or paraphernalia.
2. Spaghetti straps, off the shoulder shirts, fishnet tops, tank tops, exposed midriff or cut-off tops, or tops with low cut front or back, or large arm holes are not permitted. Sleeves must meet the shoulder.
3. Clothing must be kept properly zipped or buttoned.
4. See-through attire will not be permitted unless clothing, in dress code, is worn underneath.
5. Loose fitting hemmed or cuffed shorts that are more than 3" above the top of the knee will **not** be permitted.
6. Girls may wear dresses or skirts that are no more than 3" above the top of the knee. Split skirts may be worn in good taste and the split must be no more than 3" above the top of the knee.
7. Shirts are to be worn only as originally designed by the manufacturer. Pants (including jeans) with holes, frays, or rips above fingertip length are not permitted. Sagging is not allowed. Boys must wear pants and shorts at the hip bone. All clothing articles shall be of an appropriate size for the student wearing them. No skin may be exposed between shirt and pants at any time.
8. Appropriate undergarments must be worn at all times, and must not be visible.
9. Pajamas and/or pajama pants are not allowed.
10. Shoes must be worn. House shoes and shoes with rollers are prohibited. Athletic shoes must be worn for physical education.
11. Boys will not wear earpieces or related adornment. Girls may wear earpieces. No spacers, gauges, tongue bars/rings or other body piercing ornaments, or facial adornments are allowed.

12. Colored/tinted glasses will not be permitted to be worn inside the building, unless prescribed for indoor wear by a doctor.
13. No headgear will be worn inside the school buildings during the school day. Girls may wear bows, head-bands or barrettes to hold hair in place.
14. Sweat bands, neckbands, armbands, and/or leg bands will not be permitted.
15. "Colors" or styles of a secret society (not approved as a campus organization) are not permitted. Prohibited items may include, but are not limited to, bandanas, clothing with particular logos, arm or leg bands, etc. Specific prohibited items will be announced by the principal.
16. Any accessory or article of clothing that creates a disturbance in the learning environment will be prohibited. Extreme clothing styles/fads are unacceptable.
17. Chains of any size are not permitted on wallets, or clothing. Dog collars are not permitted. Choker style necklaces are not permitted.

ELEMENTARY CLOTHING DRESS CODE

The clothing regulations below as well as the JISD clothing regulations above are expected to be followed by all Elementary Campus students:

1. Shoes must be worn. **Flip-flops**, house shoes and shoes with rollers are not allowed.

SECONDARY CLOTHING DRESS CODE

The clothing regulations below as well as the JISD clothing regulations above are expected to be followed by all JISD secondary students:

1. Boys are not allowed to wear sleeveless shirts.
2. All long coats or jackets must be unbuttoned.
3. If undergarments are visible it will result in immediate ISS placement.

JISD DISTRICT GROOMING DRESS CODE

The grooming regulations below are expected to be followed by all JISD students:

1. Boys' hair should not extend beyond the following limits:
 - a. Front – Hair/Bangs, when combed straight down, must not be longer than the top of the eyebrows. Side - The entire ear may be covered but should not exceed the corner of the jawbone on the sides. Sideburns should not be more than one-half inch below the bottom of the ear lobe.
 - b. Back - Hair must be cut so that it is no longer than the bottom of the dress shirt collar or top of a t- shirt collar.
2. Boys' hair will not be worn in tails, ponytails, or buns.
3. Extreme hair styles or extreme colors are unacceptable.
4. Black lipstick is not allowed.

ELEMENTARY GROOMING DRESS CODE

The grooming regulations below as well as the JISD grooming regulations above are expected to be followed by all Elementary Campus students:

1. Visible tattoos are not allowed. Students marking or drawing on exposed skin will be subject to disciplinary action.
2. Boys must be clean-shaven.

3. Extreme hairstyles (e.g., shaved designs, mohawks, spikes, and dreadlocks) or extreme colors are unacceptable. Hair must be kept out of student's face.
4. Hair height may not exceed 2 inches.
5. Girls' hair must be kept out of the face such that both eyes can be seen at all times.
6. No make-up is to be worn.
7. Unnatural contacts are not allowed.

SECONDARY GROOMING DRESS CODE

The grooming regulations below as well as the JISD grooming regulations above are expected to be followed by all JISD secondary students:

1. Boys must be clean-shaven every day except that a neatly trimmed mustache will be allowed on the upper lip. No beards are permitted.
2. Hair height may not exceed 3 inches.
3. Make-up, including fingernail polish, is to be worn by females only. The application must be in good taste, must be applied in moderation, and must not contain decorative designs.
4. Students marking or drawing on exposed skin may be subject to disciplinary action.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES AND TECHNOLOGY RESOURCES (All Grade Levels)

Possession and Use of Personal Telecommunications Devices, Including Mobile Telephones

For safety purposes, the district permits students to possess personal mobile telephones; however, these devices must remain turned off and out of sight during the instructional day, including during all testing, unless they are being used for approved instructional purposes in accordance with the Acceptable Use Guidelines [See Appendix I Acceptable Use Guidelines]. A student must have approval to possess other telecommunications devices such as netbooks, laptops, tablets, or other portable computers. Refer to campus handbooks for specific regulations governing the use of electronic devices at each campus. Staff members have the final say in all situations pertaining to the use of student personal devices.

The use of mobile telephones or any device capable of capturing images is strictly prohibited in locker rooms or restroom areas while at school or at a school-related or school-sponsored event.

If a student's telecommunications device is seen, heard or used without authorization by the campus/district during the school day, the device will be confiscated. The parent may pick up the confiscated telecommunications device from the principal's office for a fee of \$15. (TEC 37.082)

Confiscated telecommunications devices that are not retrieved by the student or the student's parents will be disposed of after the notice required by law. [See policy FNCE.]

In limited circumstances and in accordance with law, a student's personal telecommunications device may be searched by authorized personnel.
