REACH

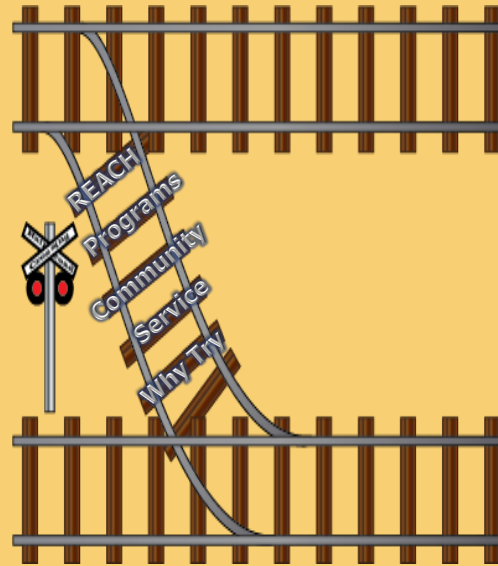

What is DAEP?

Definition

Joshua DAEP serves as an alternative education setting for students temporarily removed for disciplinary purposes from their regular instructional settings.

Mission

The mission of the Disciplinary Alternative Education Program (DAEP) is to promote an opportunity for students who have been unsuccessful in a regular educational setting to achieve academically and to learn behavioral and interpersonal skills to become more effective members of our society.

Conference

A parent/student conference with the DAEP school administrator is required to enter the DAEP program.

Length of Placement

Placement is determined by home campus administration in accordance with JISD guidelines. Student's days must be **SUCCESSFUL** in order to receive an early review and return to the home campus.



School Time

Hours

Students attend class daily from 7:40 a.m.—2:30 p.m.

Days present in DAEP are the only ones that count toward completing the length of placement.

Searches

DAEP students and any belongings are subject to search by DAEP staff at any given time while on campus. Metal detectors and trained dogs may be used to search for illegal drugs, weapons, and other unallowable items.

Trespassing

It is strictly prohibited for students assigned to DAEP to be on any JISD property except the DAEP campus and parking area.



Students may not attend or participate in any school-sponsored or school-related activity at any campus during the time that they are assigned to DAEP (in or out of district).

Transportation

A student placed in DAEP shall not be provided with transportation, unless the student has transportation designated as a related service in the students IEP. Written permission must be on file concerning transportation/walking arrangements and must be updated in writing before changes occur.

Instructional Services

Home campus teachers send work to DAEP students at least once a week. When available, students will have content-area teachers who can provide academic assistance.



Meals

Students may either bring their breakfast/lunch or order from the JHS cafeteria (restricted menu).

Any food brought to DAEP must be brought in a **clear Ziploc bag**. All lunch programs are honored. Students may bring an unopened, sealed water bottle. Otherwise, **no outside drinks are allowed**.

Supplies



No bags, backpacks or purses of any type are allowed on DAEP campus. All supplies needed for regular school work, assignments or projects will be provided by DAEP. Any prohibited items will be turned in to the principal and will not be returned. One cell phone is permitted and turned in during check in and may not be used at any time during the school day. No jewelry, ear buds or headphones may be brought to DAEP.

Uniforms



Students are required to wear a **blue colored shirt, tan/khaki pants and tennis shoes**. One pair of pants and two shirts are issued to each student upon placement in DAEP.

Hooded sweatshirts or hooded jackets may never be worn to DAEP.

Dress Code/Classroom Rules

The DAEP Student Handbook addresses specific guidelines regarding dress code (what is and is not allowed) as well as the expectations regarding classroom conduct for all DAEP students. It is the responsibility of the student and parent to review these procedures.

DAEP provides the educational supports necessary to meet the goals of the individual education plans established by ARD/504/LPAC committees for all students who qualify for special services.
